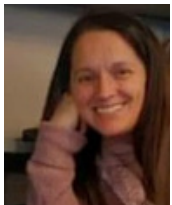

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Q1. WHAT IS A RESOURCE COORDINATOR (RC)?

A1: RC's facilitate interventions and connect our students and their families to resources (school and community) that will help overcome barriers to access, participation, and progress at school.

Q2. WHO IS ELEGIBLE FOR A REFERRAL?

A2. Any enrolled West Clermont student.

Q3. HOW IS A REFERRAL SUBMITTED?

A3. Staff will complete a referral form and RC's will complete steps to support the student through interventions.

Q4: WHAT ARE POSSIBLE INTERVENTIONS?

- Family engagement
- Mental health referrals and holistic support
- Emergency access to food & hygiene products
- Student-centered programming
- Community referrals

GOAL #1: CO-DEVELOP STUDENT-CENTERED SOLUTIONS WITH OUR FAMILIES AND COMMUNITY.

GOAL #2: ACTIVELY CULTIVATE STUDENT ENGAGEMENT, RESILIENCE, AND GROWTH OPPORTUNITIES.

Serving Our WCommunity

BACK2SCHOOL BOOKBAGS

Families may request help with supplies.

KINSHIP & FOSTER FAMILY SUPPORT

Workshops, programs, and resources are offered to families.

HOLIDAY OUTREACH

Families can request help for the holidays.

WOLFPACK CLOSET (WCMS)

The Wolfpack Closet hosts emergency IPM food boxes, Birthday Kits, and hygiene items for WC families facing setbacks.

SPRING BREAK BAGS

Along with Power Packs, students receive activities and games to encourage learning and fun.

6TH GRADE BIRTHDAY SERVICE PROJECT

Each sixth grade class donates items to create birthday kits for WC families. Each school is given free kits. Please contact your RC to pick up a kit.

SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS

WC cares about our most vulnerable families and seeks to offer a hand up rather than just a hand out. Families can request assistance.
